## First Aid

The provision of first aid facilities is essential and critical to any event or festival, and must be appropriately equipped and easy to find by patrons. The number of first aid posts required depends on the size of the event. First Aiders should be trained to level 2 competencies as a minimum.

The figures below were suggested by St Johns Ambulance Australia and can be used as a general guide:

<b>Patrons</b>	<b>First Aiders</b>	<b>First Aid Posts<sup>1</sup></b>
500	2	1
1,000	4	1
2,000	6	1
5,000	8	2
10,000	12	2
20,000	22+	4

Based on the above information there will be one permanent first aid station located next to the Volunteers Head Quarters. This will be manned at all times with no less than 4 qualified first aid personnel. There is expected to be at least one team of two first aiders in attendance during performances.

The first aid station is to be at all times under the control of the Safety Officer and the Emergency Manager or designee.

First aid is only to be rendered in accordance with the obtained skill level, and if required Queensland Ambulance Service should be notified immediately if the patient requires transport or more skilled treatment.

The number of First Aid posts required would depend on what first aid room facilities are available

The first aid station is to maintain an incident register in accordance with *Workplace Health and Safety Regulations 1997*, copies of these reports should be provided to the Council Workplace Health and Safety Officer as well as the Site Coordinator.

Furthermore at the festival, there will be several staff and volunteers in attendance some of which have persons with first aid training.

The first aid kits at the stations should be in accordance with the provisions of *First Aid Advisory Standard 2004* and stocked with sufficient items.
